of Administration issued out unto Eleanor Parke now Wife  
of Tobias Parke one of the principall Legataries within the within  
written Will of William Hamman late of Saint Andrew Holborne  
in the Countie of Middlesex deceased Co-administor the goods  
 Chattells and Debts of the said deceased according to the Tenor and  
effect of the said deceaseds Will the Exorutor being therein named  
And Abraham Jaines the other Legataries having legallie renounced  
as by the Act of Court appereth the said Eleanor being first  
legallie sworn truly and faithfullie to administer the same

# Memorandum

Mary Greenly

That on or about the latter end of February or the begin-  
ning of March One thousand Six hundred fiftie Six Mary  
Greenly of Saint Stephens Colomane Streete London  
going then sick of the sickness wherof she dyed but of her  
last will and memorie with an intent to make her last Will and  
Testament nuptialis she wrote these words or the like in effect viz  
I the said Mary Greenly Sonne to her late husband Thomas  
Greenly deceased Two boxes and all that therein were solde to him selfe  
the said Thomas Greenly Daughter of her said late husband as whos  
and all that therein was the bed and bedding and all that thereto  
belonging Two yron and brass whitt was belonging to the Whimney  
in the Chamber and also one Greene Linc boord and cloth her wedding  
ring of Gold a Silver spoon and five pound in monie the residue of  
her household stuffe not before disposed of out of which her debts and  
funerall expences are to be paid she gave to the said Henry and  
Anne Greenly to be equally divided betweene them and all other  
monie belonging to her she gave to the said Henry Greenly in the  
presence of Credible Witnesses Edward Thierd The marks of  
Edward Thierd

The fift day of May In the Year of our Lord  
God One thousand Six hundred fiftie and Seaven Letters  
of Administration issued forth to Henry Greenly one of the residu-  
arie Legataries named in this above written nuptialis Will  
of Mary Greenly late of Saint Stephens in Colomane Streete  
London Widow deceased Co-administor the goods Chattells and Debts  
of the said deceased according to the Tenor and effect of this Will now  
Exorutor being therein named he the said Henry being first

I Ellen Hazard of the parish of Saint Gyles in the shire of  
 Middow being through the goodness of God in health perfect  
 memorie and understanding this eleventh day of July in  
 the year of our Lord Christ according to the Constatation used  
 in England One thousand Six hundred fiftie and five my last  
 my last Will and Testament in manner and forme following first I  
 bequeath my Soule into the hands of Almighty God my heavenly  
 father in the comfortable hope that he will receive the same into him  
 selfe in glorie for evermore my bodie I commit to the earth from whence  
 it first came there to be decently buried in hope that the same shall by the  
 mightie power of God be rayssed againe at the generall resurrection of the  
 iust into life eternall And for those outwaie blessings wherewith it hath a  
 pleasure God to blesse me withall I dispose thereof as followeth Item I give  
 and bequeath unto my Sister Margerie Brothhouse forty shillings and  
 two paires of Shooles Item I give and bequeath to my Sister Elizabeth  
 Seares one shilling Item I give and bequeath to my loving sounne Almo  
 Coloman my best feather bed and bolster and two paires of my best  
 Shooles Item I give and bequeath to Judith Howle my servant my  
 best blue petticoate and my best redde petticoate same and my brass  
 Ware mynne panned and my best Cumber saue and Item I give and  
 bequeath to my loving sounne Master William Heyern my gold death  
 heade ring and my best hatt and soe much of my redde wax as shall amount  
 unto twenty shillings Item I give and bequeath unto Ellen Greene  
 the said Coulorde Cloth Goals which was my husbands for her forme  
 and my Greene Rugg for her selfe And alsoe much of my goods not  
 otherwise disposed of in this my present Will as shall amount unto  
 the value of twenty shillings Also I give and bequeath unto my said  
 Sister Margerie Brothhouse soe much of my redde wax as shall amount to  
 the value of twenty shillings And I doe hereby ordeine and appointe  
 my loving sounne and Neighbour Master Benjamin Sherwood and  
 Master George Sterne Exorsors of this my last Will and Testament  
 nothing doubting of thaire Care diligens and faythfulnes in seeing  
 the same duly performed according to my true intent and meaning  
 therein ordeined And I give and bequeath unto each of them  
 my said Exorsors forty shillings a peece which I praye them kindly  
 to accept as laboure of my reward to them And I will that my said  
 Exorsors shall be saved harmless and indemnified from all Charges  
 and expenss they shall be putt unto in the execution of this my  
 said Will out of any of my goods Chattells and monies not disposed  
 of in this my said Will The rest and residue of all my said goods  
 Chattells debts monies appoynted Linnen wollen brass pewter Iron  
 and other household stuffe whatsoever not otherwise disposed of in this  
 my last Will after my debts funerall Charges and legacies first paid  
 and discharged I give and bequeath unto Judith Howle my servant  
 afore said And I doe hereby publish this present writing Consisting  
 of two Shooles of paper sealed together on the toppe on both sides  
 to be my last Will and Testament In Testimonie wherof I have  
 hereunto sett my hand and Seale In the presence of thise  
 Witneses whoe haue to each of the said Shooles of paper subscribed
