 and direct that any debts which may owe at my decease and my funeral  
 expenses and the charges of proving this my will shall be paid as soon  
 as conveniently may be after my decease and I assign and assign the  
 amount which I have recently made and examined of two thousand one hundred and  
 sixty pounds about six for the equal benefit of my faithful and trusty in  
 said George Purcell and Jane Fox And I give and bequeath to the  
 said George Purcell all my silver plate and plated goods and my carriage  
 carriage and horses or ponies and stable furniture and utensils and my  
 chest in the parlour to and for his proper and absolute benefit and disposal  
 free from legacy duty also I give and bequeath to the said Jane Fox my  
 feather bed and bedstead mattress and bedding with all belonging to it  
 and my time-piece and watch and all my bottles and wearing apparel  
 of every kind and description and all my household linen and all my wooded  
 work to and for her proper and absolute use and benefit and disposal free  
 from legacy duty and I will and direct that none of my other servants in  
 who shall be living with me at my decease shall be allowed and paid  
 a months wages according to their respective rate of wages over and besides  
 what shall be due to them for wages at my decease and that none of my  
 other servants shall also be allowed and paid for board wages for a  
 month after my decease and I also give five guineas each of my servants to  
 purchase mourning all which last mentioned provisions and bequests for  
 my said servants I hereby direct shall be also paid free of legacy duty  
 and all the Rest and Residue of my estate goods chattels and effects not  
 before disposed of and every part thereof I give and bequeath to the said  
 George Purcell to and for his proper and absolute use and disposal And  
 I constitute and appoint the said George Purcell sole Executor of this my  
 will And I revoke and make void all former wills and testaments by me at any  
 time heretofore made and declare this to be my last will and testament
